A MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT VAL BACH

Greetings everyone,

Vacation Bible School is going on today, as I am writing this message. My grandchildren were so excited to go and have been counting down the days; with the exception being Liam (who is extremely shy and cries as his mom drops him off at swim lessons, summer school, preschool and now VBS)! He told his mom last night that he knows about God and Jesus, so he doesn't need to go to Vacation Bible School.

Isn't that how many of us think at different times in our lives? "I don't need a refresher course on that...I've been doing this forever and I know everything I need to know." I personally have found that no matter how much I think I know about any subject, there is always more to learn or things I may have forgotten or a new way to look at things or a need for renewed focus and excitement.

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BOB GIESE

Dear members and friends of Our Saviour's and St. Paul's congregations:

Exciting things have been happening with our newly formed parish.

First of all, Barb Krug has been approved by Bishop Laurie and the Synod Council to be a Synodically Authorized Minister (SAM). We'll have her Rite of Authorization at our joint service at Our Saviour's on July 30. This authorization means she will be able to consecrate Holy Communion for our congregations as well as engage in other pastoral duties as needed. She and our

congregation councils have already signed a contract/covenant so she can begin being "our SAM" August 1.

On July 20, our congregations had joint Vacation Bible School. VBS was at St. Paul's in the morning and Our Saviour's in the afternoon. Forty students plus a bunch of adult and teen leaders helped make this a wonderful experience for all. Thanks to all who participated! My morning class was a cooperative game I designed based upon the morning theme - the Israelites and the Golden Calf story in the Old Testament. Each class worked together to answer questions and gain points which were marked on a "giving tree." The goal was to earn as much as possible (\$1 for each correct answer with the money provided by a willing donor) to be used to purchase a gift from ELCA Good Gifts. In the end, all the classes together won \$150, enough to purchase an entire fruit tree farm to be given by Good Gifts to a family in need. Thanks for your good work VBS students!

Finally, on July 18 Pastor Teri Hanson of Colby and the Trinity Lutheran Unity Council reached an agreement for Pastor Teri to contract to be Trinity's 1/3 time pastor beginning September 1. (Pastor Teri is already pastor of the UCC congregations in Colby and Athens.) This is exciting news for Trinity. It is also good news for us, because it means I can focus my energy as Administrative Interim on St. Paul's and Our Saviour's, and it's one less congregation to provide guest worship leadership for.

The Call Committee is working with Synod staff Pastor Randy Olson. No news concerning a new pastor candidate, but rest assured our congregations' leadership are making sure the mission and ministry of our congregations continues and grows!

Church Council Meeting Minutes

Wednesday, July 12, 2023

<u>Members Present</u>: Sally Lemke, Dan Higgins, Leon Gasek, Heidi Haynes, Dave Hraby, Carrie Zirngible, Val Bach and Gail Heurung. Missing: Kathy Hackbarth and Marie Koerner. Guests present: Nancy Jones and Tina Dassow. Pastor Bob joined via zoom.

Meeting called to order at 6:03 by President Bach. Pastor Bob led the council in an opening prayer. Looked at concerns - keep family of Ethan Berry in prayers.

Motion by Sally, second by Dan to accept the agenda - motion carried.

Motion by Leon, seconded by Dan to approve the minutes from the prior month. Motion carried.

Business:

<u>The treasurer's report</u> was discussed. Noted that \$2500 was sent for benevolences and that the mortgage had made good progress. We are at the point where we would like to consider a push to pay off the mortgage....Looking towards fall when school is back in session and vacations are slowing down.

Question on the Chequamegon contribution of 10 cents per member and if we do that...Nancy reported that the payment was made at the beginning of the year.

Discussion about wrapping up payments on the repairs...which are almost completed. Heidi will ask her husband to have Combined finish up now that the carpet is installed. Once the carpet bill and the Combined bills have been paid, we will determine what to do with the excess...apply to mortgage or save it for roofing that is needed. Interest rate on the mortgage is 4.625%....about \$380 per month in interest. Motion by Dave, seconded by Gail to accept the Treasurer's Report - motion carried.

<u>Worship team</u> - Pastor Bob is pretty much lining up supply pulpit right now. We have two openings in Sept. Dave will tentatively take Sept. 10 and Val will handle Sept 24. Pastor Bob will continue scheduling for October and Pastor Nancy plans to continue on the last service of the month.

<u>Sunday School</u> is still out for the summer. VBS is set for next week Thursday. Starting at St. Paul's then heading to Our Saviour's. The bus will deliver back to St. Paul's at the end of the day. Leon is looking at getting the confirmation program set for informational meeting the end of August.

<u>FIN</u> has nothing right now - looking at some questions to pose to the congregation maybe later this fall. Sue King will head the bible study...she is looking at the how and when at this time and will let the congregation know.

<u>Call committee</u> has met a few times and have finalized their 1st and 2nd interview questions. They plan to meet again here soon to address inevitable questions that may come up from our previous history and how they best may be answered.

<u>Repairs</u> are almost done as discussed, now there was a discussion on storing things - like the sewing supplies, the boxes for food pantry, etc. Things may have been moved from where they were kept originally; may have to search for things. Recommend looking for the best storage arrangements. Discussed possible need for painting downstairs. Not known right now if needed.

Used lawn mowers were sold - one for \$20 and one for \$25....proceeds to mortgage.

<u>Discussion on the joint church agreement</u> and how the "split" is going to be handled. There is a request for information regarding our general giving and different categories of members. Council has no problem supplying the information, but noted that the agreement was based on church attendance...and we have no interest at this time to change the configuration. Val invited interested council members to attend the next joint meeting.

Joint worship is set with a potluck for July 31 at 9:00 at Our Saviour's. Our Saviour's will supply the egg bakes, St. Paul's the beverages and then dishes to pass from both congregations.

<u>Barb Krug</u> is now an officially approved SAM (Synodically Authorized Minister) and will now be available to assist both congregations in preaching, visitations, teaching and communion, when necessary. Congratulations to Barb! The church joint council approved compensation to be the same as the supply pastors. Her installation will be on July 30 at the joint church service.

Where Are Our Roots?

As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving. Colossians 2:6-7 (NRSV)

The way in which a plant is rooted in the ground affects its growth. Wild Sarsaparilla has fleshy, long, creeping rhizomes. While moving some loose soil such a long fleshy root was found. It seemed to extend far beyond the place where the plant originated. The creeping rhizomes of this plant help it to establish new colonies of plants.

The "roots" of a believer need to be in Christ Jesus the Lord. If growth is to take place and new "colonies" of believers established they need to come from being rooted in Christ. Being rooted and built up in Christ and growing in faith, the Christian is enabled to give thanks over and over for the life-giving strength obtained from the Lord. The Christian abounds in thanksgiving.

Help us to realize that by being rooted in you can grow in faith. Thank you for sustaining us through the power we receive from being rooted in you. In your name we pray, Amen
