# A Message from Pastor Nancy

What did Jesus look like? If we follow the biblical account that he was from a family from Nazareth, then he had dark hair and eyes and olive-hued skin. Some facial hair. Garments of woven linen or similar blends that covered most of the body to keep one protected from the hot sun and winds.

Several years ago, I discovered a confirmation book printed in the 1950's with lessons about Jesus. It included images of Jesus painted by artists from all over the world. Guess what? Jesus resembled the people of the artist's place of origin. Chinese. South African. Native American. Mexican. The amazing thing is that God came to be with us as one of us human beings. "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.....grace and truth came through Jesus Christ." (John 1:14, 17B).

This image of Jesus is called "The Risen Christ by the Sea" by Jack Jewell. It's a favorite of mine for two reasons. (1) Jesus is smiling broadly; he actually shows his teeth. You can't say that about very many images of Jesus! (2) Jesus is holding on to the fishing net and a boat is seen in the background. To me this shows a robust and energetic Jesus! Yes, he sat and told lots of stories but he also had to walk lots of miles!



Whatever your favorite image, the important thing remains that Jesus shows us who God is and what God wants for us: unconditional love and abundant life.

We had a unanimously successful vote on Sunday, January 22, to move forward with forming a joint parish between St. Paul's and Our Saviour's Lutheran Church of Holway. The efforts to prepare, inform and present the Joint Parish Agreement were met with overwhelming support by both congregations. A big shout out to everyone involved in this effort.

Our next steps include finalizing our Ministry Site Profile (MSP), which is essentially St. Paul's resume and job posting all in one. Once the finalized MSP is completed, we need a successful congregational vote to proceed with submitting the MSP to the Synod. Thank you, Transition Team, for your diligent efforts in completing the Ministry Site Profile in such a very thoughtful, thorough and timely manner.

One of the other exciting changes that comes in 2023 is Pastor Nancy beginning her "real" retirement. While we will certainly miss her great sermons, sense of humor and devoted leadership, we also recognize that because of her, St. Paul's congregation was able to see how truly caring about <u>our</u> ministries as "<u>the church</u>" allowed us to become stronger as a congregation. Our members truly make this church!

We have witnessed the power of "God's Work, Our Hands" in so many ways throughout these past challenging years. And our devoted desire to continue St. Paul's and Our Saviour's ministries together allows us to continue to grow and become stronger as God's church while we begin our search for a pastor.

Benevolence Form & Commitment – Review in January after Annual Report.

**Faithful Innovations Network (FIN) Update** – Met December 8. Working on four questions to address with congregation. Next meeting will be in April.

#### Update on St. Paul's / Our Saviour's Multi-point Parish Discussions

- Received email from Barb Krug (Our Saviour's) on 12-13-22 expressing concern from some members that need to be addressed before we proceed. Our Saviour's will be having conversational meeting on 01208223. St. Paul's council agreed on importance of a similar meeting also scheduled for 01-08-23.
- Both congregations need to complete their own Ministry Site Profile.
- Following 12-07-22 joint council meeting, a question was posed to Pastor Randy whether we should be considering
  a yoked parish agreement or a contract. A parish agreement invites a fuller participation in the ministry of the
  congregations like sharing in staffing and programs whereas a contract is an agreement between one congregation
  and the pastor for services provided by that pastor. Pastor Randy recommended a parish agreement based on our
  current parish' status and discussions.
- Joint councils to prepare a "shared ministry agreement" reflecting the decisions from Holy Conversations.

- Only one congregation will actually "call" the pastor but with the joint agreement in place it doesn't matter who extends the call. Both congregations will be served.
- Requested specific verbiage to use when presenting the joint proposal for vote. Congregational votes are scheduled for 0122-23 at both churches.

Pastor Randy advised we review our respective constitutions on matters of forming a partnership. He is also requesting Pastor Erin provide us an example of an actual motion from a recent vote to form a multi-point parish.

• Reviewed St. Paul's Ministry Site Profile prepared by Transition Team. Motion by Gail / Seconded by Kathy to approve with changes as noted. Sections IV and V have not been completed yet.

Current Ministry Site Profile indicates St. Paul's has 900+ active members. Membership list was emailed to council members prior to meeting. Gail to draft letter to be sent to all St. Paul's members requesting membership status be confirmed via email or phone call. Those who do not respond will receive a follow up phone call from a council member. Ministry Site Profile to be updated once process is complete.

• Request for Additional Wireless Microphones – received donation of microphone for Worship Hall. Need to evaluate capabilities of sound current system for available ports before further research into adding additional microphones in sanctuary.

**Opening Prayer:** Pastor Nancy

#### **Business:**

**Pulpit Supply:** Nancy has February filled and all of March except for one Sunday. Pastor Nancy will be handling our Ash Wednesday service. Still looking to fill our Easter Sunday supply. Val mentioned that Pastor Bob Giese may be able to assist with one Sunday a month.

**Membership Update**: Nancy reported that right now just over 100 families have responded to our membership confirmation request. Will announce again in church on Sunday, January 15th.

**Sunday School:** nothing to report — Sunday school just got started up again here.

**Council member updates:** Heidi will stay on council as will Dave Hraby. Marie Koerner has agreed to be put on the ballot for Tina Machon whose term is ending.

**Open Custodial Position**: Bob and Kathy Harris are currently handling the custodial duties but would like to have the position filled permanently. Roughly 3 to 4 hours a week basically...some extra with wedding or funeral work. Nancy will add to the announcements and newsletter first. If need be, we can advertise.

**Soundboard/Microphone Update:** Nancy Jones, with the help of Ross and Kathy Hackbarth, looked at our soundboard. Not a user-friendly system. If more microphones are needed, we may need to look for professional help. Kathy will contact Scott Woller to see if he has any insight to the system we currently have.

# Walnut Family Black Walnut "Eastern Black Walnut" "American Walnut" (Juglans nigra)

For I am longing to see you so that I may share with you some spiritual **gift** to strengthen you --

Romans 1:11



In autumn, large, round, nuts fall from mature Black Walnut trees. If you find nuts among the leaves, notice that they have a soft outer husk that covers the hard shell. People and squirrels compete for the tasty fruit. The husks were used by pioneers as a dye for clothing.

The leaves turn color. Leaflets fall off the long midrib. The tree produces a chemical called juglone. The roots and the leaves contain this chemical. It inhibits the growth of some plants so they will not grow and compete near the tree. For that reason, leaves from this tree are not put on compost piles. They can be bagged and put in places other than the garden or flowerbeds.

The wood from Black Walnut Trees is highly prized and used to make fine furniture.

Think of the many uses of this tree. Its fruit, wood, and natural dye are gifts from it. Each of us has spiritual and other gifts to share with others. What gifts can each of us share?

Help us to use the gifts we have to help others. In yourname we pray, Amen.
