A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR BOB GIESE

Members and friends of St. Paul's:

It's hard to believe we'll soon be entering my fourth month as your "administrative interim." In case you don't know what that means, my task is to help St. Paul's Medford (as well as Our Saviour's Holway and Trinity Unity) make sure there is a continuation of good ministry and leadership for worship during the ongoing pastoral "vacancy." This means you'll probably only see me on Sunday morning about once a month, but I will be working behind the scenes with the church council, the joint council (St. Paul's and Our Saviour's), and the call committee. I will also be making shut-ins and sick calls when possible.

In working with the leadership or St. Paul's so far, I am highly encouraged by the way your leaders are dealing with change. Instead of looking back to the "good old days," they are focusing on the future of the congregation and the new relationship with Our Saviour's. I know change is difficult, but we live in a time when it is important.

In particular, St. Paul's has now entered into a parish agreement with Our Saviour's Holway. Initially the main benefit this will have is pooling financial resources as the search for a new pastor continues, which may make affording a new pastor more realistic. But there are other possibilities for the future. The two congregations have already been doing VBS together. Cooperation on more community ministries is likely for the future. I know having a parish partnership is new for St. Paul's, so you may still have concerns about this for the future. If so, please talk to your leaders or me about it.

You may have already noticed changes in Sunday Worship. Beginning in June, St. Paul's moved its Sunday Service start time fifteen minutes later to 9:15 a.m. (while Our Saviour's moved 15 minutes earlier to 8:00 a.m.). This is to make it possible for pastors or other worship leaders to travel between the two congregations. The worship liturgy has been shortened a bit to accommodate the organists' needs, The congregation council has asked me to try to schedule at least three Sundays a month with a guest pastor. As we move forward, Pastor Nancy and I are willing to each lead worship once per month, which means finding another guest pastor each month. So far that has worked out fine, but there is a huge shortage of pastors in our Synod (and the whole ELCA), so there will be Sundays when lay members of the congregations will be leading worship and presenting the message, too.

If you've been worshipping with us recently, then you've already been blessed to be a blessing. If you've been absent for whatever reasons, I encourage you to come be part of our Sunday morning worship blessings! You, too, will be blessed to be a blessing!

Wednesday, June 14, 2023

<u>Members present</u>: Marie Koerner, Heidi Haynes, Leon Gasek, Val Bach, Carrie Zirngible, Dave Hraby and Gail Heurung. Missing: Sally Lemke, Kathy Hackbarth and Dan Higginss. Guests: Pastor Bob Giese and Nancy Jones.

Meeting was called to order at 6:06 p.m. by Val Bach who led the group in a prayer. Milestones and concerns were given.

Motion by Dave, second by Marie to accept the agenda...motion carried

Motion by Leon, second by Dave to accept the meeting minutes from May 10th...Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's report</u>: Nancy addressed items of interest on the Treasurer's Report. Motion to approve the report by Gail, second by Leon...Motion carried.

<u>Membership update</u>: Val discussed the Status of Membership updates. Discussed friends and members. Val will talk to Our Saviour's to see what exactly they are looking for. Nancy gave updated numbers - 593 active members, 357 inactive members. Households were 452 are now 228 active and 105 inactive and 40 deleted.

Lay people: Short discussion on lay workers in the church. Next month, Val would like to look at recruiting lay people in the church.

<u>VBS</u> is set for July 20th. Will start promoting. Nancy reminded the group that Food distribution will be that same day at the church.

<u>FIN</u>: Leon will talk to FIN group - possibly address some FIN questions as the message on a Sunday we need a worship leader.

<u>Freezer</u>: Leon said that there are only about 20 pizzas left in the downstairs freezers. Once the food share is done this week...hopefully we can move the pizzas to the freezer in the welcome hall and turn off the freezers downstairs to save energy.

Joint Council will be meeting on July 11th and will plan the July 30 Joint Service at Our Saviour's.

<u>Call Committee</u> has been putting together interview questions in preparation for any upcoming interview we may have. 30+ vacancies right now....not enough candidates to go around.

<u>Repairs</u> - Val will be in touch with Perrin's on the flooring. We also need some more painting done on the walls to the bathrooms....and some rooms downstairs. Will put up an announcement looking for someone to paint..

<u>Community Mission with Jesus</u>: Val is still the Community Mission with Jesus contact....Many large requests in the past month.

<u>Discussion on the benevolences for 2023</u>. We would like to work on quarterly contributions. A motion was made by Leon, seconded by Marie to take \$2500 from the general fund and make a payment to the Synod for benevolences for the 2nd quarter. We will address the 3rd quarter in September and the 4th quarter in December. Motion carried.

Vacations: No vacations planned for staff at this time.

<u>Pride Poster</u>: Val had a request to put up a poster for the PRIDE group. Okay with the council, as we believe in inclusion and all are welcome.

<u>Shut-ins</u>: Bob showed us a card that he is sending to shut-ins introducing himself and giving them his contact information.

Lawn Mower: Discussed the used mowers...a motion was made by Gail, seconded by Leon to have Val put the mowers that Dave Bach has looked at on the Marketplace...motion carried.

Adult Bible Study: Sue King expressed interest in leading the adult bible study. Val will reach out to her.

A motion to adjourn by Dave, seconded by Marie, motion carried.
