MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

The Mobile Food Pantry served 65 households on May 18.



50 individuals ages 0-17 70 individuals ages 18-59 <u>60 individuals ages 60+</u> 180 total number of individuals

28 individuals visited the pantry for the 1st time 2,140 pounds of food were distributed

Items distributed included: ham, ground pork, bread, cheese/pepperoni, cottage cheese, sunflower seeds, snack bars, baked beans, cereal, crackers, bakery, frozen yogurt, popcorn, nuts, light bulbs, sanitizer, & disinfectant

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Wednesday, May 10, 2023

<u>Council Members:</u> Val Bach, Sally Lemke, Marie Koerner, Dan Higgins, Leon Gasek, Dave Hraby and Gail Heurung. Missing - Heidi Haynes, Kathy Hackbarth and Carrie Zirngible. <u>Guests:</u> Tina Dassow, Nancy Jones and Pastor Bob.

Meeting called to order by Val Bach at 6:05 p.m. Val led the group in an opening prayer. Milestones and concerns presented - Nancy updated the group on Pat Johnson, Dave mentioned his daughter is turning 16 on Mother's Day. Motion by Marie, seconded by Sally to accept the agenda - motion carried Motion by Dan, seconded by Leon to approve the March 29 meeting minutes.

BUSINESS

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Note the report sent had flip flopped mortgage and general giving ...Tina has it corrected and the report sent out in the newsletter will be correct. Discussion on amount of funds that we have and what we may want to do with it. A few bills, Kramer, Combined and Perrin's to be paid as yet. Leon mentioned that when we reach the \$100,000 balance on the mortgage...we should plan a push to pay off the balance. A motion was made by Dave and seconded by Leon to approve the Treasurer's report - motion carried.

<u>Worship Committee:</u> Pulpit supply is handled until September, except July 9, September 10 and September 17. Dave volunteered for July 9. Leon will check with Dawn about possibly having a play...Val may also take one of the Sundays.

<u>Membership Update</u>: Individuals count is now 580 down from 894. Households now 225, down from 296. Val mentioned there was a discussion on determining our financial split with Our Saviour's and how that was determined. Looking at it again in January. Val will clarify any questions regarding our membership numbers. Leon talked about new prospective members...one of the items people are looking for is Adult Bible Study. We will put out requests to see who may be interested.

<u>Sunday School/VBS/Confirmation</u>: Sunday school has completed. Confirmation was successful and VBS is set for July 20th. Kathy, Heidi and Barb Krug are working together in planning.

<u>Joint Parish/Pastoral Search Committees</u>: Committees are set and working together. Gary Jensen has agreed to be the Treasurer of the Joint Parish Committee. Right now there are 34 open positions on our NW Synod....more than double the usual amount.

<u>Update of church repairs</u>: Val Higgins did the painting...thanked her in church on Sunday. Discussed how much money is left in the Building Maintenance and the funds left from the insurance money...Val wanted to let everyone know that she checked with Church Mutual and any funds not required to pay for our repairs in our funds and do not need to be returned to Church Mutual.

<u>New church times:</u> Beginning June 4 our church time switches to 9:15 a.m. Emails have been sent and postcards are prepared to go out. Some other things we are looking at changing...cutting down on the readings...possibly having the first hymn in the PowerPoint. The offering will be collected at the back of the church...saving having the offertory. All things to cut back on the timing. The joint accounts will not need any funds until January 1. Everything is separate until that time. Joint services are set for the 5th Sundays.

<u>Supply Preaching Fees:</u> There was a discussion regarding the \$150 we currently pay in the NW Synod for Supply Preachers. The Eastern Synod currently pays \$200. Motion by Dave, seconded by Gail to raise to the \$200 fee (along with transportation) on September 1, 2023. Motion carried.

<u>Emergency Care</u>: Discussed our list of who to contact. Discussed the visiting of our shut-ins as well. Pastor Bob and Nancy work out who needs to have a visit. We may need to look at getting some of our lay people involved in this as well.

<u>Synod Assembly:</u> Unfortunately, St. Paul's was not represented at this year's meeting. Pastor Bob updated the group on what was addressed at the meeting.

<u>Community Mission With Jesus:</u> Therese Gretzinger is the contact for the group. Val was looking for anyone who is willing to be on the contact list for the group. Some names were brought up to ask.

Nancy reported that she checked into Dropbox storage as backup for our church records. We have too much information for the free Dropbox and the storage we would require is \$10 a month. A motion was made by Leon, seconded by Dan that we subscribe to the Dropbox at approximately \$10 a month. Motion carried. Sally and Gail will assist with the blood drive on May 25th.

FIN: No new updates at this time.

Vacations: None scheduled at this time. Nancy is looking for a late start on May 24.

Next Meeting: Set for June 14th at 6:00 p.m.

Motion by Marie, seconded by Sally to adjourn. Motion Carried. Meeting adjourned at 7:18 p.m.
