



The Black Locust tree grows quickly and spreads easily . Small thorns are located on the branches of young trees. Thorns protect the saplings.


Our Lord wore a crown of thorns when he suffered and died for us. We do not know what kinds of thorns were used, but thorns hurt when they pierce our flesh.

Council Meeting Minutes - February 8, 2023

<u>Council Members</u>: Val Bach, Leon Gasek, Kathy Hackbarth, Heidi Haynes, Gail Heurung, Dan Higgins, Sally Lemke, Carrie Zirngible, and incoming new member—Marie Koerner.

Call Meeting to Order: Meeting called to order by Val Bach at 6:45 p.m.

Opening prayer: Val Bach
Devotion: Val Bach

Adoption of Agenda: Motion by Sally, Second by Marie

Motion to record / approve Council meeting minutes from January 11, 2023: Motion by Sally, Second by Leon

Reviewed 2023 Annual Congregation meeting minutes from February 5, 2023.

Business:

Election of Officers

President – Val nominated by Gail, seconded by Heidi. Val accepted. No other nominations. Val voted as President.

Vice President – Leon nominated by Sally, seconded by Gail. Leon accepted. No other nominations. Leon voted as Vice President. Financial Secretary – Sally no longer interested. Marie nominated by Carrie, seconded by Gail. Marie accepted. No other nominations. Marie voted as Financial Secretary.

Secretary – Gail nominated by Kathy, seconded by Sally. Gail accepted. No other nominations. Gail voted as Secretary.

Reports:

Treasurer – Will see additional \$1,219 expense coming up as February is WE Energies budget bill settlement month. Monthly budget amount will then increase to \$329.

Financial Secretary – nothing notable to report.

Motion by Leon, second by Sally to accept reports.

Worship Team Update Including Pulpit Supply: Pulpit filled through April 16, spotty in May and June

Determine What to Do with Money Found in Parking Lot: Motion by Gail, second by Kathy to deposit unclaimed money. Will hold funds until July and apply to benevolence if not claimed by July 2023.

Narrative Lectionary vs. Revised Common Lectionary: Our Saviour's has been using the Narrative Lectionary and St. Paul's has been using the Revised Common Lectionary. The Narrative Lectionary attempts to include stories and scripture the Revised Common Lectionary omitted. Bob Giese stated it will not work to have the congregations using different lectionary if we intend to utilize shared pulpit supply as the lectionaries have different weekly readings and gospels. This would mean a pastor would have to prepare two separate sermons. Pastor Nancy has not used the Narrative Lectionary. Discussions will continue as how to proceed when there is shared pulpit supply.

Status of Membership Update: 296 letters mailed / 137 responses / 159 not returned. Sally will lead next steps of writing verbiage, so communication is kept consistent, obtaining a list from Nancy of who has not responded, and assigning names to people helping with the process. Some congregation members have offered to assist with phone calls.

Sunday School: High attendance compared to same time in previous years. Earning tickets to Cupid's Carnival could possibly be helping keep children intrigued.

Confirmation: Some students slow to return paperwork. Confirmation set for April 30, 2023.

Installation of New Council Members: Planning for February 26 which is the same Sunday Pastor Nancy is scheduled to help welcome new members.

Review of Thrivent Funds to Mortgage as Approved at Annual Meeting: Nancy Jones and Tina Dassow to make transaction.

List of Members with Keys: Reviewed list of key holders. Members who may not be using keys will be contacted. Denied request from Chris Konieczny to be issued a key for work she does with Comfort Quilts; can access building during office hours or obtain key from Kim Gasek who is assigned a key for Comfort Quilts group. Agreed Chris could sign-out a key with Nancy Jones if she has an upcoming need for a key and is unable to obtain the key from Kim Gasek. Trying to keep number of keys issued from spiraling out of control.

Background Checks Required: People who work with youth are to have background checks on file with the church. Leon to find out how to proceed and put together a procedure.

Contact List for Church Alarm: Current contacts are Dan Higgins, Clem Johnson, and Leon Gasek. Okay with keeping multiple people listed. Dan to lead task of developing a list of who to call in different situations.

Custodial Position: Dawn Kasper Harder interested in applying. Will provide application and set up interview with some executive committee members. Justin's ending wage was \$12.10 per hour. Determined \$12 per hour as wage to offer.

Update on Insurance Claim for Water Damage and Repairs: Adjuster completed his report; ready to submit claim; including plumbing and boiler pump repairs, carpet replacement for entire Welcome Hall, drywall repairs, wood trim, baseboard, paint, Master Clean's remediation and electrical. Claim to be submitted to Church Mutual week of February 6, 2023.

Performance Review: Nancy Jones' current wage is \$15.45 per hour with 18 approved paid hours per week. Nancy has been donating an additional seven hours per week to accomplish necessary tasks. Motion by Heidi to allow Nancy up to 25 paid hours per week, if needed, and increase her wage to \$16 per hour effective February 1, 2023. A friendly amendment was made by Marie, seconded by Gail to change effective date to January 1, 2023. After reviewing previous meeting minutes, friendly amendment was removed changing effective date back to February 1, 2023. Motion passed.

Review of Insurance Policy: Placeholder for January 2024 (recommended we not switch companies during a year we've filed a claim)

Benevolence Form & Commitment: Payment of \$2,500 issued in January will be applied to 2022 fiscal year at ELCA. Re-evaluate additional payments in July 2023.

Faithful Innovations Network Update: Answers from first week's question are posted in Welcome Hall. Three more questions coming up.

Update on St. Paul's / Our Saviour's Multipoint Parish Discussions:

Joint Parish Agreement signed by Barb Krug (President of Our Saviour's) and Val Bach (President of St. Paul's) on January 22, 2023, following unanimous votes by both congregations to proceed with joint agreement to take effect on May 1, 2023.

Worship times remain a concern. 8:15 for Our Saviour's and 9:15 for St. Paul's is what is being proposed. Received feedback from three different pulpit supply pastors stating this is not sufficient time (even with leaving Our Saviour's after communion). Pastor Nancy willing to preach at both services using this time schedule; will provide honest feedback on feasibility to continue these times.

Pastor Bob Giese has agreed to act as Administrative Interim Pastor for St. Paul's and Our Saviour's. Each congregation would pay \$200/month for the services as noted in the agreement. The agreement would take effect April 1, 2023, and continue through when a Pastor has been called. Motion made by Gail and seconded by Sally to move forward with the Administrative Interim Pastor Agreement.

Ministry Site Profile: Val shared St. Paul's completed MSP with Our Saviour's and Pastor Bob Giese. Pastor Bob suggested we not limit ourselves to a newly or recently ordained pastor stating there may be a retired pastor looking to come to a more rural area. Will discuss with Pastor Randy Olson on March 19, when he comes to lead worship and meet with Council and Transition team to review MSP.

Next meeting: Wednesday, March 8, 2023, at 6:45 p.m. Val will be on vacation. Leon will lead meeting.
