Church Council Meeting Minutes

Wednesday, March 29, 2023

Meeting called to order at 6:03 p.m. Val led the group in an opening prayer. Concerns – sympathies on the death of Heidi's mother-in-law.

Members present: Sally Lemke, Marie Koerner, Val Bach, Heidi Haynes, Carrie Zirngible, Dan Higgins, Leon Gasek and

Gail Heurung.

Guests: Nancy Jones

Members absent: Dave Hraby, Kathy Hackbarth.

Motion by Marie, seconded by Sally to accept the agenda – motion carried.

Motion by Leon, seconded by Dan to accept the March 8 meeting minutes – motion carried. Marie suggested that going forward we add the words motion carried to our motions to reflect the passing or not passing of the motions.

BUSINESS

REPORTS:

<u>Treasurer's Rep</u>ort: Because this meeting was held early – no treasurer's report. Confirmed that the Script money was paid out .

<u>Financial Secretary</u>: nothing to report, but discussion held on lack of giving numbers on the contributions. Request will be made for people to start using their # on their contributions.

Worship committee: Music is selected thru the Easter seasons. Nancy has the pulpit supply filled thru June 4.

<u>Membership update</u>: Each council member has been working on the lists that were given to them. Set Sunday as the deadline for turning them in.

<u>Sunday School, Confirmation, VBS:</u> Confirmation is set for April 30. Sally will introduce the confirmands and read their Bible verses. Sunday School continues to go well and nothing has been set for VBS.

Joint Parish Council and Call Committee: For the Joint Parish Committee -Val and Barb Krug, as Council Presidents will each serve on the Parish Council. Therefore, St. Paul's needs two more members. Leon spoke with Gary Jensen and he is willing to serve and Val spoke to the Schumacher's. Kathy Schumacher is willing to serve on the Parish Council. A motion was made by Gail, seconded by Leon to appoint Val, Gary and Kathy to the Joint Parish Council – Motion carried

<u>For the Call Committee</u> – Val mentioned that Pastor Randy from the Synod said that as Council President – she should not serve on this committee. Val talked with Tony Schumacher and he is willing to serve. Heidi Haynes and Marie Koerner from the council also were willing to serve. A motion by Gail, seconded by Sally to appoint Tony, Heidi and Marie to the Call Committee – motion carried.

<u>Taylor House</u>: Mike Lindau would like to come in and speak to the congregation about Taylor House...to speak to their needs and what they do. Will invite him to do so, but not on Easter or Confirmation.

<u>Synod Assembly:</u> Set for April 29. Still looking for people to attend the meeting in Rice Lake. Val requests that we let her know if we can attend or if we know anyone else who can.

<u>Kathy and Bob Harris:</u> Thank you to Kathy and Bob for handling our church housekeeping in the interim. A motion was made by Gail, seconded by Heidi to purchase Script cards as a thank you – motion carried. Val will take care of getting the thank you prepared and sent to them.

<u>Update on Repairs:</u> The check is in and now we have the Master Clean billing. We have a \$500 limit on bills without authorization. However, we will pay bills that we have the approved estimates on and bring any not pre-approved to the council for authorization to pay. Will wait to decide on flooring until everything is completed. Val is asking for quotes on different types of flooring – carpet, carpet tiles, etc. Motion by Gail, seconded by Sally, to pay all billings as they are received per estimates – motion carried.

<u>FIN Project</u>: Leon reported that their final meeting is April 13 – finishing up compiling information gathered. Good feedback on the discussion held. We have the tools and may be able to hold more discussions going forward.

<u>St. Paul's/Our Savior's – Parish Discussion</u>: New committee meeting set for April 5th. Val will let our members know. May 1 our new agreement goes into effect. Will discuss things like the lectionary – narrative or common – and church start times. Pastors feel the amount of time between services is not sufficient for the Pastor to have any time with the parishioners. Agreement with Pastor Bob is all set – starts April 1. Val and Nancy will work with Bob on preaching and finding preaching responsibilities. Emergency contacts for ministry are all set as well.

<u>Misc</u>: No vacations scheduled for the staff at this time. Leon reported that background checks are all set – with Nancy keeping a spreadsheet on them so we know when they are due. Nancy had a request for sponsorship of the Farm Safety Books for the FFA. Decided not quite in the realm of our benevolent giving. Nancy shared that we have been challenged by the Methodist church for a pedal tractor race for Maple Fest. We need to get a team together.

Next meeting – May 10th at 6:00 p.m.

Motion by Gail, seconded by Heidi to adjourn – motion carried.
