A MESSAGE FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT VAL BACH

Greetings everyone,

St. Paul's collected a Noisy Offering on Sunday, August 20, to help raise funds for the Community Mission with Jesus. As always, our members stepped up with open hearts. Thank you, St. Paul's.

CMWJ is an inter-denominational, non-profit ministry seeking to help people of all races, creeds, colors, languages and nationalities within our local community.

I have had the opportunity to serve as St. Paul's representative on the CMWJ committee. It is our job to review the incoming requests and weigh in on whether to allocate funds for the request, and if so, how much. The requests often tear at my heart.

I am amazed to hear just how many people in our small community live in hardship and face serious challenges regularly. I was oblivious to how many people are actually homeless in this area. I would have never guessed this to be the case. I have had my eyes opened with regards to how many people are unable to financially pay their heat and electrical bills, only to find out once warm weather hits, their utilities are shut off because of their inability to bring their balance current.

It's hard to replace the wonderful feeling associated with helping someone else in need. Whether it's lending an ear to a friend or family member or a complete stranger when they need you. Helping someone with their groceries, raking your neighbor's yard, dropping off a meal for a family who is mourning the loss of a loved one, donating to an organization or cause that makes your heart feel good. Helping others is always rewarding not to just the people you are helping, but to you as well.

The loss that Maui is facing after the devastating wildfires is unfathomable. With the death toll rising and a large number of people still unaccounted for, the friends and family members are left with minimal hope of being reunited with their loved ones. As I listen to some of the people affected by this tragedy, I have heard many stories of how their faith and the generous outpouring from people they don't even know has kept them going. My prayers go out to everyone suffering a loss from this catastrophic event!

Our faith is one thing we can always count on. God is our rock, our constant! He provides us opportunities to help others in so many ways, just as He is there to help us, to turn to in need. Pay God's gifts forward (your gifts) and relish in the wonderful feeling it brings back to you. Give thanks with a grateful heart each and every day!

MOBILE FOOD PANTRY

The Mobile Food Pantry served 75 households on August 17, 2023.



41 individuals ages 0-17

77 individuals ages 18-59

67 individuals ages 60+

185 total number of individuals

39 individuals visited the pantry for the 1st time.

1,252 pounds of food was distributed: chicken drumsticks, ground turkey, cheddar cheese, cottage cheese, tomatoes, blueberries, mac & cheese, cereal, oatmeal, bread and bakery, snack bars, and sauce packets.


LIFE LESSONS from MARK

Maple Family Boxelder "Ashleaf Maple" "Manitoba Maple" (Acer negundo)



Praise the LORD from the earth, you sea monsters and all deeps, fire and hail, snow and frost, stormy wind fulfilling his command! Mountains and all hills, fruit trees and all cedars! Psalm 148:7-9

This fast-growing tree in the maple family can reach a height of thirty to sixty feet. It has pinnately compound leaves with three to seven leaflets that are pointed at the ends. In fall, the leaves turn brown or yellow and fall from the tree. The bark is light gray and has narrow furrows and deep ridges. Male and female flowers come in spring and are on separate trees. Seeds may hang on the tree until winter. Birds such as Evening Grosbeaks come in flocks and eat the seeds in winter. Some people do not like to plant the female or seed bearing Boxelder trees because in fall they often attract hundreds of orange and black Boxelder bugs. The bugs do not damage the trees or bite or hurt people, but sometimes they become a nuisance when many of them gather on the sides of buildings looking for winter shelter.

Enjoy looking at the Boxelder tree. Who and what in creation might sing praises because of the presence of this tree?




